

A DANGER

Firearms users must understand and obey the Rules of Firearms Safety:

- 1. All firearms are always loaded.
- 2. Never let the muzzle cover anything you're not willing to destroy.
- 3. Keep your finger off the trigger until your sights are on target.
- 4. Be sure of your target and what's beyond.

AWARNING Failure to heed these warnings or follow the operating instructions may result in negligent discharge of a firearm, causing serious injury or death.

Read and understand all owner's manuals, instructions, and guides prepared by the manufacturer of your firearm prior to use.

Galco holsters are designed to carry specific firearms.

AWARNING Before use, be sure the holster selected is designed and intended to carry your particular firearm.

AWARNING Carrying a firearm in an ill-fitting or improper holster can result in serious injury or death. The purchase and use of a Galco holster is at the sole and exclusive risk of the user.

READ AND UNDERSTAND THIS ENTIRE GUIDE PRIOR TO USING THIS PRODUCT

Firearms are inherently dangerous. Improper or careless use of a firearm or firearm and holster may result in serious injury or death. It is the user's responsibility to possess a thorough knowledge of, and be properly trained in, all aspects of firearm use, including holster use and safety.

AWARNING Do not place a loaded firearm in a holster without first testing — with a firearm double-checked and verified to be unloaded — for a proper firearm fit.

A CAUTION Tension units are not pre-set at the factory. If a holster has tension units, it is the user's responsibility to ensure they are adjusted to retain the firearm.

Carry the firearm in the safe condition recommended by its manufacturer. This information will be contained in the product information manual provided by the firearm manufacturer. If you do not have the manual applicable to the firearm, contact the firearm's manufacturer.

Always ensure the firearm is fully seated in the holster, and that it activates all automatic or manual retention devices (when provided). Retention devices must be used when provided.

AWARNING If the firearm is not properly secured by means of friction or the retention device(s), it could become dislodged, causing injury and possibly death to the user and others.

AWARNING Never holster a firearm in the single-action mode, unless it is a semi-automatic pistol and holster designed and intended for "cocked and locked" or "Condition One" carry.

AWARNING Always ensure that a single-action pistol carried in "Condition One" has the manual safety engaged when carrying in a holster.

AWARNING Do not attempt to cock a holstered firearm as this may damage the firearm, the holster, or both, and may contribute to a negligent discharge.

AWARNING Always protect an exposed magazine release from accidental activation.

WARNING When drawing a firearm from the holster, DO NOT place your finger on the trigger, in the trigger guard, or near the trigger. Position your finger along the frame of the firearm, above the trigger guard. Keep your finger off the trigger until your sights are on target.

A significant number of negligent discharges
— some resulting in injury or death—occur while holstering
a firearm. Most are caused by the user's index finger
pressing the trigger. Some are caused because a foreign
object becomes entangled or trapped in the trigger
guard/holster and presses the trigger. The safest practice is
to "look the firearm into the holster." With a pocket holster,
this must ALWAYS be done with the holster OUT OF
THE POCKET. While holstering, be fully cognizant that:

1. All safeties are engaged.

2. Your index finger is straight along the firearm's frame. DO NOT place your finger on the trigger, in the trigger guard, or near the trigger. Keep your finger off the trigger until your sights are on target.

3. Your shooting-hand thumb is placed over the hammer or the rear of the slide. This will enable you to feel if the hammer starts to move rearward or the slide begins to come out of battery.

4. You strictly observe Rule of Firearms Safety #2: never let the muzzle cover anything you're not willing to destroy. This includes your support hand and any other body part.

5. After the firearm is securely seated in the holster, you carefully replace the holstered firearm in your pocket.

6.Do not place your support hand (or other body parts) at the bottom of the holster or in front of the muzzle. The holster material is not bullet proof. Neither your support hand, nor other body parts, nor other people should be muzzled/flagged while holstering.

MARNING A firearm (whether in or out of a holster) may discharge if it falls to the ground or onto another object, causing death or serious injury. Holsters are not designed or intended to prevent firearms from discharging when dropped.

Always place your hand on the firearm and holster when running or performing other physically vigorous activities.

It is the user's responsibility to maintain the holster by regularly checking component parts for excessive wear and proper function. This includes, but is not limited to, tension units, snap closures and retention devices.

Checking tension units each time the holster is used is required as part of your regular safety inspection. Applying a small amount of clear nail polish to the threads of the tension units, after proper adjustment, will help minimize screw loosening.

AWARNING Do not use customized, modified, worn or broken firearms, or those otherwise outside the original manufacturer's specifications, in a Galco holster.

Do not in any way modify, disassemble, or remove any part from this holster, except as approved and recommended in Galco's Product Information Guide.

Do not rely on any holster being "snatch proof" regardless of the number of retention devices it may feature. Rely only on proper training and situational awareness.

CARRY CONDITION OF THE FIREARM

AWARNING Some single-action revolvers and some semi-automatic pistols must be carried with the hammer or firing pin resting on an empty chamber.

Carrying any firearm with a live cartridge in the chamber immediately in front of the firing pin may cause a negligent discharge. Holsters are NOT designed to prevent firearms discharge if dropped. Information regarding the safe carry condition of your firearm will be contained in the product information manual provided by the firearm's manufacturer. If you are unsure of the safe carry condition(s) of your firearm, contact the firearm's manufacturer.

AWARNING Galco holsters with retention straps intended for single-action pistols (such as the 1911) are designed for "hammer down, empty chamber" carry, unless otherwise specified. Galco holsters without retention straps (open top) are designed to carry single-action pistols in all safe conditions of carry as specified by the firearm manufacturer.

Galco has made every effort to properly label all holsters for the specific firearms they fit. However, firearms manufacturers often make changes to their firearms that affect holster fit.

Galco will not be responsible for such changes, nor for typographical or other human errors that may occur. It is the user's responsibility to ensure proper holster fit with actual firearms.

It is important to understand that all products, including firearms and holsters, may eventually "wear out" or become unsuitable for the function for which they were designed. Stress and strain placed on a product will vary according to frequency and conditions of use, and therefore it is difficult to indicate a recommended replacement date for this product.

INSPECTIONS / MAINTENANCE, ADDITIONAL USER RESPONSIBILITIES

NOTICE It is the user's responsibility to ensure that the item remains serviceable and safe, and able to continue service within its design intent.

AWARNING It is the user's responsibility to inspect the holster before and after each use for signs of excessive wear or loss of retention capability, and appropriate tightness of all hardware.

PRODUCT IDENTIFICATION

Galco products are generally identified with a two-part code stamped into the holster body or label affixed to the item.

An alphabetical or alphanumeric prefix identifies the holster model. For example, the FLETCH model's prefix is FL while the Royal Guard's prefix is RG.

The numerical suffix identifies the particular firearm the holster is intended to fit. For example, the 212 suffix indicates a 5" 1911 while the 224 suffix indicates a Glock 17. The letter "B" or "H" at the end of the code indicates color. B is for black, H for havana brown, while no letter generally indicates tan.

Thus, an FL212 (FL + 212 + no letter) will be a tan FLETCH to fit a 5" 1911, while an RG224B (RG + 224 + B) will be a black Royal Guard for a Glock 17.

Holsters intended for Galco's modular shoulder systems display letters and numbers that correspond to guns. A Miami Classic holster intended for a SIG P320, for example, will simply read 820. A VHS 3.0 holster intended for a Beretta 92FS will read V3-202.

The numerical suffix of holsters intended for right-hand or ambidextrous use will end in an even number. The suffix of holsters intended for left-hand use will end in an odd number.

You may use the "shop by gun" feature found at our website, GalcoUSA.com, to locate a holster fit. Simply enter the model number on the item (FL224B, for example) in the field. POCKET HOLSTERS

Pocket carry offers unique advantages. The gun carrier can casually place a hand on the holstered pistol if a nonspecific threat materializes – and the fastest draw is to have the gun in hand. While commonly used in a front pants pocket, jacket and cargo pants pockets are often applicable, as well. Galco's pocket holsters conceal the shape of the gun so that its outline is not printed through the garment.

Galco pocket holsters are designed to keep the handgun or magazine in a consistent and upright position for ease of draw. The holsters are designed to catch on the pocket so that, with practice (using an unloaded firearm) the firearm or magazine can be drawn with a "hooking" technique (as shown in illustrations). This allows a smooth draw of the firearm or magazine while the holster remains in the pocket or falls away.

▲ WARNING

Always remove the holster from the pocket before holstering the handgun!

FRONT POCKET HORSEHIDE HOLSTER

Galco's Front Pocket horsehide holster is constructed from premium horsehide. The holster uses two leather hooks, which catch the top or bottom pocket corner on the draw.

POCKET PROTECTOR HOLSTER

Galco's Pocket ProtectorTM is constructed of Premium Center Cut SteerhideTM. Reinforcements at the holster mouth and beneath the trigger guard keep the holster stiff enough to allow a smooth draw. The holster's hook at the base of the firearm's trigger guard is designed to catch on the bottom corner of the pocket.

STUKON-U POCKET HOLSTER

The StukOn-U[™] holster's Gripper Shell[™] surface and 420 denier packcloth lining assist in keeping the holster in the pocket during the draw. Combined with the "hooking" technique illustrated, this allows one-handed release of gun from both pocket and holster.

POCKET MAGAZINE CARRIER

The Pocket Magazine Carrier (PMCTM) is constructed from Premium Center Cut Steerhide and carries a single spare magazine in the support-side pocket. The PMC features an adjustable tension unit. The hooked shape is designed to catch on the corner of the pocket and retain the carrier in the pocket during the draw.

▲ WARNING

Keep your finger off the trigger until your sights are on the target!!

Do not place a loaded firearm in a holster without first testing – with a firearm double-checked and verified to be unloaded – for proper firearm fit.

CARE, MAINTENANCE AND STORAGE DO

NOTICE

Full grain leather holsters that come in contact with bodily perspiration, the elements, or become soiled on a regular basis may need to be treated periodically to slow the natural breakdown of the leather fibers. Dry the leather naturally, without any type of artificial heat.

Clean synthetic material as needed by hand using a soft bristle brush. If additional cleaning is needed, wash by hand with a mild soap and water. Allow to air dry naturally.

Dirt and grit trapped in your holster may harm your firearm's finish. To clean your holster, especially after use in dusty conditions, simply wipe out the interior of the holster using a clean, damp cloth.

Do not store your firearm in a holster if the holster is damp from perspiration or in otherwise moist condition.

Do not use LocTite® or threadlock. Out-gassing from these adhesive compounds will adversely affect plastic, nylon and rubber holster parts.

Do not put Galco synthetic material products in the washing machine.

Do not submerge or saturate your leather product in water or any other liquid or dry your leather product with heat from a dryer, oven, radiator, direct sunlight, etc.

Do not use products such as Neats Foot or Mink oil, as they will damage the leather. Additionally, do not use Galco Leather Lotion or other leather conditioners on Premium Center Cut Steerhide or synthetic materials.

Do not leave your Galco product on the dashboard of your car in summer, or leave it otherwise exposed to the elements.

The above care and maintenance instructions cannot substitute for your good common sense. Following our recommended care and maintenance tips, along with common sense, will allow you to get the maximum service life from your Galco products.

HOLSTER FIT / BREAK-IN 👺



Galco's full grain leather holsters are made of the finest materials and are precision molded to specific firearms. It may appear the holster fit is too tight at first, but this is by design. We engineer our holsters to fit tightly knowing the leather fibers will relax to the proper fit with use.

▲WARNING UNLOAD YOUR FIREARM

(chamber, magazine, cylinder) before testing holster fit.

If the holster has tension screws: Tension units are not pre-set at the factory. You may need to adjust them in order to holster your handgun the first time. We recommend that you check your tension screw adjustments before each use. There is no reason to completely remove tension units. Do not use LocTite® on tension units. However, a single drop of clear nail polish applied to your tension screw threads may reduce its unwanted loosening.

If the fit is too tight when holstering your firearm the first time don't force it. If you do force the firearm into the holster it may be very difficult to remove. Instead, follow these simple steps to break in your new holster using a process called blocking:

- 1 Place the unloaded firearm in a plastic freezer bag, or cover it in 2-3 layers of plastic kitchen wrap. Do not cover
- 2 Insert the bagged/wrapped firearm slowly into the holster, gently twisting it side-to-side to minimize tearing of the
- 3 Once the firearm is completely seated in the holster, twist it approximately 1/16" in both directions 6-12 times.
- 4 Allow the bagged/wrapped firearm to sit in the holster for approximately 15 minutes.
- 5 Remove the firearm from the holster and remove the bag/wrap from the firearm.
- 6 Insert the unloaded firearm into the holster, which should now be snug but not loose. If it is still too tight, repeat the above steps until the holster is broken in to your satisfaction.


HOLSTER FIT / BREAK-IN (continued) '

Following and repeating the above instructions is the only way to an ideal break-in and long service life with proper fit that will last many years. It is common for the inside of a leather holster to scratch from a single holstering (called etching). A smooth leather lined holster will be even more subject to this normal occurrence. After this initial etching, the holster will custom fit your firearm.

Some modern pistols have very sharp edges, particularly surrounding the ejection port. This may cause an initial feeling of "dragging" on the draw, but will normally resolve quickly with just a few draw-and-holster repetitions.

Try our Draw-EzTM applied to the inside of your leather holster to shorten the break-in period and provide a slicker draw. Draw-Ez only treats the interior surface of the leather and will not be absorbed by the leather or harm the finish. Do not use Draw-EZ on Premium Center Cut Steerhide.







Technique I Hooking the trigger guard tail hook on the bottom of the pocket while drawing.

STUKON-U POCKET HOLSTER DRAW




POCKET PROTECTOR DRAW





